Bill Introduced to Replenish RRF

ENTRÉE Act sponsored by MO Congressman Blaine Luetkemeyer

Last night, Congressman Blaine Luetkemeyer (R-MO) introduced the Entrepreneurs Need Timely Replenishment for Eating Establishments (ENTRÉE) Act which provides \$60 billion in additional funds for the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) and includes a plan for where the funds will come from.

The ENTRÉE Act will:

- Provide \$60 billion to the Small Business Administration's (SBA) RRF, paid for by rescinding money from unspent Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) and state and local funds within the American Rescue Plan.
- Increase oversight responsibilities and audit requirements for the SBA.
- Require all applications to be received, reviewed, processed, and disbursed on a first come, first served basis.

This is a second formal bill introduced for additional funding. The main difference between the bills is that this one includes a plan for paying for the additional \$60 billion. The replenishment bills will not be brought to the floor for debate unless there is broad bipartisan support. *Congress heard our voice when they created the RRF – they need to hear from us again to ensure it receives more funding.*

If you care about the RRF and agree that the struggles of the restaurant industry warrant continued federal support, we urge you to weigh in with your representatives in Washington. **Add your voice**, share your perspective, and together we can move Congress to support our local restaurants.
